

In our worship, we strive to witness to the wholeness of God, embracing the diversity of images of God that are found within Scriptures. We will seek to include male, female, and gender-neutral language and imagery for God, and utilize language that helps to avoid binary terms in pronouns and images of people. In our hymns and liturgy, we invite you to use pronouns that best express your practice and affirm your faith.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Christmas Eve Worship. Tonight we will celebrate the nativity with three different worship services. All services include candles and singing Silent Night.

4 pm - A service of the Christmas Story designed for children and families. Children will be invited to participate in creating the Nativity.

7 pm - Lessons and Carols. Throughout the season of Advent, we have lit the candles of hope, peace, joy, and love. Tonight, we light the Christ candle to honor that Christ is our Light. We will raise our voices to sing Christmas carols accompanied by brass instruments, listen to the Scripture lessons of the shepherd's amazement, and end our night raising our candles and singing "Silent Night."

11 pm - Lessons and Communion. In a quieter spirit we sing carols, listen to the beauty of the oboe, and come to the communion table to receive the bread of life and the cup of blessing. If the weather cooperates, we will take our candles to our front steps and sing "Silent Night" as a call for peace and goodwill for all persons.






