





For this first Sunday of black history month, we hear the words of a black woman who is a young adult, which is fitting, as we celebrate the ministries of young adults on this day in our worship.

Cole Arthur Riley is the creator of This Here Flesh and Black Liturgies, a space where Black words of dignity, lament, rage, and rest, are curated and integrated with a liberating spirituality. She serves as the content and spiritual formation manager for Chesterton House: A Center for Christian Studies at Cornell University. Cole Arthur Riley bring black theology that speaks to the beautiful concept of representing God fully. This includes language, bodies, values, and stories. The author's work gives language to her own experiences while touching on how spirituality can be impacted by identity and community.

...In mutuality, belonging is both a gift received and a gift given. There is comfort in being welcome, but there is dignity in knowing that your arrival just shifted a group toward deeper wholeness.

People talk about God as three distinct people in one. If this is true, it means the whole cosmos is predicated on a diverse and holy community. And if we bear the image of God, that means we bear the image of a multitude. And that to bear the image of God in its fullness, we need each other. Maybe every culture, every household, every community bears that image in a unique way.



While a lecturer in Sacred Music at Yale's Institute of Sacred Music and Divinity School, Miller is also a Professor of Church Music, Director of Chapel, and Composer In Residence at Drew University in Madison, NJ. He further serves as Minister of Music of Christ Church in Summit, New Jersey.

Mark Miller's hymns and anthems are sung by communities of faith throughout the world, Miller himself travels the world leading worship, preaching, teaching, and presenting concerts focused on creating community and advocating for social justice.

When he's not working Mark is home in Plainfield, NJ with his husband of 28 years, Michael Murden. Together they have raised two children. Today in worship, as we enter a month of lifting the voices of black hymn writers, composers, and the traditional African American Spirituals, the Chancel Singers are delighted to share with us Mark Millers' arrangement of the traditional African American Spiritual – God's Got the Whole World.
