NEW SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS: CENTERING YOUTH AND INVITING ALL

This Fall, we are re-launching youth Sunday School for all students from 6th grade through high school. Classes will meet each week following worship and focus on learning about the Bible while engaging important current issues as well as spiritual practices. While this class is designed for young people, "grown-ups" are invited as well for a family learning experience that is designed with young people in mind. YOUTH GROUP BEGINS SEPTEMBER 15TH

Youth Group will begin on September 8, in the Youth Lounge from 6-7:30 pm and is open to all youth from 6th through 12th grade. This is a space for young people to be in friendship with God and with one another, and to build lasting relationships through play, reflection, and worship. We will meet every Sunday evening from 6-7:30 pm with occasional variations on the time for special events. A full schedule through Christmas Break will be provided at our September 8 Rejoice Sunday meeting.





CONFIRMATION

Confirmation is a two-year process open to all youth who are currently in 7th grade or older. The purpose of confirmation is to help young people explore their faith through bible study and christian formation. Our first meeting this Fall will be held on September 15 immediately after worship. We'll then meet on the 3rd Sunday of each month throughout the year. Students who have completed the two-year confirmation cycle will be invited to join the church on Confirmation Sunday on May 18, 2025. A full schedule of meetings, retreats, and times will be provided for all participants via email and hard copy on the 9th. Everyone (current and new students) must register on the Google form provided in upcoming Around the Corner Emails and Youth Group Emails.

HELPING OUR NEIGHBORS MINISTRY

In early June, we shared how Helping Our Neighbors (HON) had helped 200 families avoid eviction and utility shutoffs. Since then, our workload increased to over 60 calls a week.

The Kalamazoo Gazette reported that many in our city live paycheck to paycheck. An unexpected \$400 expense can cause financial turmoil. ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Restrained, Employed) describes these individuals. Disabled individuals, with monthly incomes under \$1000, face even greater challenges, with rising rents and utility costs.

In response, the Mission of the Month for August was HON. A special offering was taken on August 11, and we encouraged volunteering to answer calls for help. Ann and Ray Sweany, Carolyn Murphy, and JoAnne Lehman were the contacts for volunteers. Janine Kennedy stepped down after 5 years of service.
