BUILDING UPDATES

Many projects around the church have been completed or are very close to completion. These include the Building Restoration, Inc. project. They cleaned the exterior, tuckpointed numerous joints, fixed the cross high above our entrance, secured many slate tiles, added copper flashing in several areas, replaced approximately 1500 square feet of concrete and re-caulked our front steps. A huge thanks to the Building and Grounds Team, especially Mitch Wilson and Tom Schaberg, for coordinating these repairs with Building Restoration.

In addition, about half of our flat roofs have been replaced and should be set for the next 30 years. The front doors are looking good again with fresh paint and shining bronze hardware. The "antique" streetlight in front of the tower doors has been updated to a new and more efficient LED-style fixture. The light pole has also been straightened after years of sagging.



FINANCE COMMITTEE NEWS

The past year has been a transition in staffing and responsibilities surrounding our finances. During this time, we engaged an outside resource to do a thorough review and reconciliation of our books. That project has concluded and the end result will improve overall efficiency for our staff and speed up the timeliness of our financial reporting.

We are now preparing the 2025 budget. Through October, our giving totaled \$879K and our expenses totaled \$961K; thus, we currently have a year-to-date operating deficit of \$82K. Although this is within the 2024 budget (which was approved as a deficit of \$129K), and we do have reserves to cover this year's shortfall, we will be unable to continue to operate at a deficit moving forward. Therefore, please remain faithful in your end-of-year giving as we hope to finish as positively as possible, and submit your intended giving for 2025, if you have not done so. Thank you!

If there is a particularly unique answer, I will turn to that youth and ask them, "Say more about that?"

As I reflect on our youth ministries this fall my word is SUS-TAINING. "Say more about that..." you say? Sustaining because it has been a place that is developing a sustaining faith life within our young people—and honestly, in the lives of our leaders as well. Sustaining because it is a sustainable youth ministry. We consistently have a solid number of middle and high schoolers, as well as a reliable crew of adult leaders. Sustaining because I have witnessed friendships forged from memories made among young people who attend different schools and prioritize their Sunday nights together. Sustaining as students with busy fall schedules are always right back with us when the soccer...or volleyball...or the Academically Talented Youth Program comes to an end.
