We need 70 church members in attendance for this amendment to be considered. The Endowment Committee is responsible to the Board of Trustees and Church Council for receiving donations and directing the investment activities of the Endowment Fund. The amended policy would allow undesignated gifts to be allocated 25% to the Endowment Fund and 75% to the Board of Trustees. It would also provide more flexibility for the use of Endowment Funds, e.g., major church projects and borrowing from the Endowment principle. The summary version of the policy is included in today's bulletin. The full motion to be voted on is: The Endowment Committee, Board of Trustees, and Church Council hereby move the adoption of the Amended and Restated Endowment Policy presented at this Church Conference of March 2, 2025, to be effective some great conversation and laughter! immediately.
