

CHARTRES LABYRINTH

There is a long history of the use of labyrinths in Christian worship. Labyrinth prayer walking can prepare our spirits to be part of God's Kingdom. The labyrinth is set up in Wesley Hall through Good Friday, April 18. You are invited to walk the labyrinth before and after worship on Sundays, or Monday - Thursday between 9am-4 pm.

HOLY WEEK EXTENDED WALK TIMES: On Holy Thursday, the labyrinth will be available from 9am to 8:45pm. On Good Friday, you may walk the labyrinth from 6:15pm to 8:30pm.

Several people can walk the labyrinth at the same time, but please allow participants to walk slowly. Our labyrinth requires the removal of your shoes to preserve the cloth of the labyrinth. There will be information about the history of the labyrinth and the rhythm of walking it. We encourage you to try this ancient prayer practice to quiet your mind, center yourself, and allow your spirit to be in prayer.
