It is possible that we will all have moments in our lives that we might call Holy Shifts. These are moments like Moses's encounter with a burning bush. Something happens. We may or may not even know it at the time, but there is some kind of encounter with God or perhaps God was at work in the midst of an event. Then there is a shift. We see ourselves differently, perhaps more clearly as if looking in a mirror for the first time. God has called us to holy ground and a shift within has occurred. We interact with the world and ourselves differently, in a more intentional manner.

During Lent, our worship will challenge us to deepen our awareness of self—to pivot from looking through a lens into a mirror. Each week aligned with the scripture reading of the day, storytellers will tell of their own moments of Holy Shift that they've encountered. There will be words to listen for each time. As a community, we will hear stories of holy shifts and hopefully individually, we will identify within ourselves, holy shifts. We will all have a chance to wander more deeply into these stories after worship in Sunday School.

Preserving Our Sacred Space

Over the past five years our Trustees and Buildings & Grounds committees have committed to ensuring the exterior of our building remains safe and intact. We just completed a multiphase project to repair mortar joints (tuck pointing), soffits and traceries, and overall cleaning. Our efforts now turn to our beautiful stained glass windows. Although the windows themselves are in good condition, the polycarbonate external covering has exceeded its life expectancy, has become "cloudy," and the venting necessary for the stained glass is failing. It has become time to replace the polycarbonate with a solution which will provide protection for decades to come.

We have selected Glass Traditions (based out of Sturgis) to remove the polycarbonate, perform any necessary repair work, and install a properly vented glass covering to protect the stained glass. Glass Traditions came highly recommended by our exterior vendor partner, Building Restoration, and recently completed similar work at First Congregational. We will phase the project, with the first phase costing \$250,000. Work will start in March with the "Gifts of the Spirit Windows," the six full windows and the one half window on the south side of the church. This phase is funded through a combination of our building reserve fund and bequest gifts left to the church.

FINANCIAL PICTURE

Greetings from the Finance Team! 2024 is in the "books" and we have provided the below chart with our key figures for the year. Our total income was right on track coming in at \$1,054,000, compared to the budget of \$1,045,000. Total expenses were just slightly below our \$1,174,000 budget at \$1,167,000.

As many may recall, we began 2024 with a budgeted deficit of \$129,000, with the hopes of finding ways to close the gap throughout the year. We certainly made some headway, but did end the year with a \$113,000 shortfall. We started 2024 with a \$178,000 surplus in our General Fund account, however, which is effectively our beginning checkbook balance." With the \$113,000 actual deficit and some reclassification of dollars to some designated funds from our 2024 account reconciliation project, we are starting 2025 with a General Fund balance of \$47,000.

The Finance Team is working hard on the 2025 budget development, alongside Church Council, ministry teams, staff, and an ad-hoc budget committee. For 2025, we have received 150 pledges toward the budget totaling \$795,000, which compares to 159 pledges for \$820,000 last year. While that is a slight decrease, we have seen increasing trends in areas like unpledged giving, endowment earnings from the Trustees and building usage fees, which resulted in \$250,000 in income last year over known pledges. However, in referring back to the chart, you can see that it now takes a minimum of close to \$1.2 million to support our worship, many important

ministries, our wonderful staff, and the beautiful building.

The ad-hoc committee is wrapping up some important, creative work to address the ever changing dynamics of funding our church and should have more to report in the coming weeks. If you have any questions, please reach out to either one of us.
