Our congregation is blessed with members who support our ministries in so many ways. We recently learned that one of our members who passed away last year, Alice Wall, left our church a substantial bequest. Alice participated in our worship and prayer life through Friendship Village, where she resided since 2007. She had been regularly cared for by our pastors and lay visitors, and she valued her connections to our congregation and its community outreach.

Alice was born in Grand Rapids, graduating from Ottawa Hills High School, and then went to the University of Arizona, Tucson where she earned her BA, majoring in Spanish. She worked at Dow Chemical Company as a secretary for 19 years before moving to Washington, D.C. where she worked at The Bureau of National Affairs as an Index Editor/Information Specialist for 17 years. After retiring in 1990, Alice returned to Michigan to be closer to her family, and she became very interested in the Kalamazoo County services for persons with developmental disabilities. She met President Barack Obama when he officiated at Kalamazoo Central High School's graduation in 2010.

Alice has left our church an exceptionally generous bequest of \$3.8 million. This gift has been given to First UMC without restrictions, allowing our church leaders maximum flexibility to determine the best ways to use these funds to support our church and its ministries. Our Endowment Policies stipulate that 25% of the bequest goes to our Permanent Endowment Fund. With this gift, the Endowment Fund balance will increase from its current value of \$1.8 million to approximately \$2.7 million. Earnings from the Endow-

ment Fund provide important support to our operations. In 2025, the Endowment Fund will disburse \$63,000 to the operating budget. This bequest will increase the annual disbursement to approximately \$135,000 over the next few years.

The balance of this bequest (about \$2.8 million) will go to the Board of Trustees' discretionary fund. The Trustees are responsible for the repairs and capital improvements to our beautiful facility. This is a huge and increasingly expensive task, as we have an old and historically significant church building. The Board of Trustees has no independent source of income, nor any direct allocation from the church's annual financial campaign, so the Board relies on gifts, grants, and bequests like this to keep our church building safe, accessible, and supportive of our ministries.

There have been many times in the past when the Trustees have had to defer needed capital repairs due to lack of funding. We have been fortunate that major gifts in the past five years have allowed us to address needed repairs to the church—including roof replacements, tuckpointing the entire limestone exterior, HVAC repairs, upgrades to our technology infrastructure, repairs to the organ, and replacing protective covers on some of our stained-glass windows. Over the last decade, such projects have cost an average of \$150,000 per year. There are major projects on the horizon that are still needed and will be expensive, such as upgrading elevator controls and determining ways to make our sanctuary fully accessible.

This unexpected gift from Alice Wall allows the Trustees to address these needs (cont. on p. 4)

and to ensure continued maintenance of our facilities. The Board of Trustees have invested these funds with the United Methodist Foundation of Michigan, a century-old institution committed to serving Michigan United Methodist churches with socially responsible, faith-driven investments and charitable-giving services.

Even with this gift, there remains the need for our congregation to continue its generous support of the annual operating budget, which this year is over \$1.1 million. These funds cover staff salaries, routine building costs, office expenses, Christian education, and our obligation to the United Methodist Church. We hope and expect that our members will continue their support for the people and programs that are funded by the operating budget, as well as support for emerging ministries and special outreach projects.

Our congregation's long history of supporting community ministries is important both to our Wesleyan tradition and to the spiritual growth of our church. The Trustees will be working with other church leaders regarding the use of this gift to continue our faith tradition of outreach to the community. Updates on the use of this bequest will be regularly published in future issues of *The First Word*.
