FUMC Supports Literacy in All Families throughout the Year

Twelve years ago, Dolores Hedanus and the Outreach team of FUMC approved the distribution of new books to the children who visit our food pantry. Since 2013, approximately 7,000 books have been chosen by children who otherwise may not have had a book of their own.

In Kalamazoo County 13% of our residents over 18 read at the lowest literacy rate and there are at least 25,000 people who are considered struggling readers. To bring about change to those statistics, our Outreach Team remains committed to giving new or very gently used, engaging books. We believe all children need to see themselves in books and offer multiracial books, both fiction and nonfiction.

We are grateful to have purchased the majority of the books from Scholastic Literacy Partners and to Ladies Library Association for its contributions to our pantry distribution.

November is National Family Literacy Month so if you have any questions or would like to support literacy in all Kalamazoo families by contributing new books, please contact Dawn Wheaton, who is the new coordinator of the book distribution.
